


THIS STONE IS FROM THE FOUNDATION OF THE CHEVIOT HILLS MANSION






Section of original station fence dividing




The first gate of its type on the CHEVIOT HILL ESTATE Consructed by JOHN SINCLAIR 1879



ANCHOR

This was salvaged from the "Tainui" wrecked north of Gore Bay on the 16th September 1919 while carrying 1808 cases of benzine from Lyttelton to Wellington. The benzine exploded and the Tainui became a wreck, and only one of the crew of nine survived.

HAND FORGE D ANCHOR CHAIN

This chain was salvaged fromk the "Maud Graham" a wooden schooner of 80 Tons which was wrecked at port Robinson on 18th Augus 1899 while loading wheat for Auckland.




His Majesty King Edward VII never visited Cheviot. The tradition of planting of exotic trees was instituted by Robinson and continued into the 20th century.



The Chairman Petrie was the first to use the pool aided by five locals who threw him in as an unplanned part of the opening ceremony.




Drinking fountain
